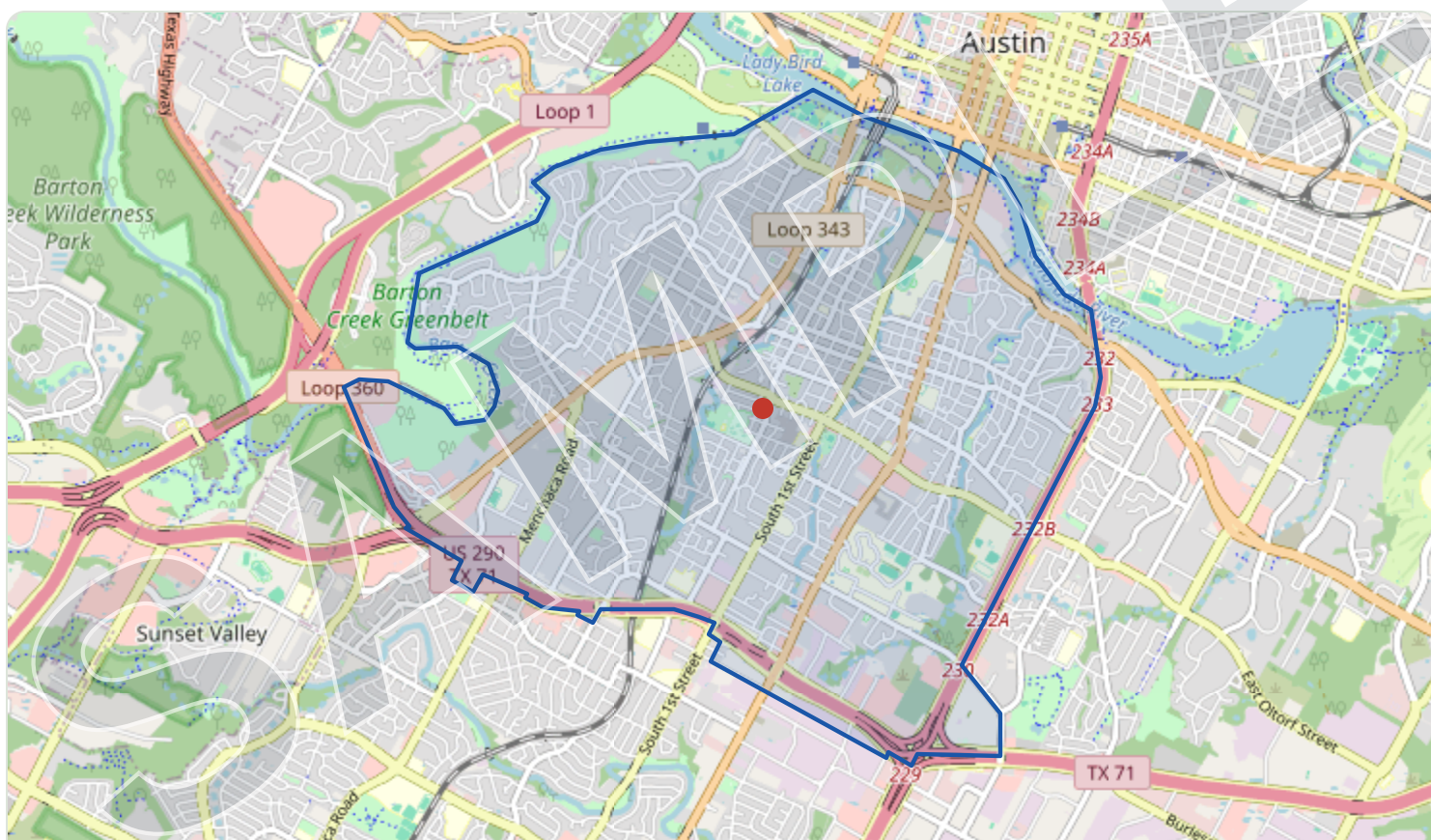

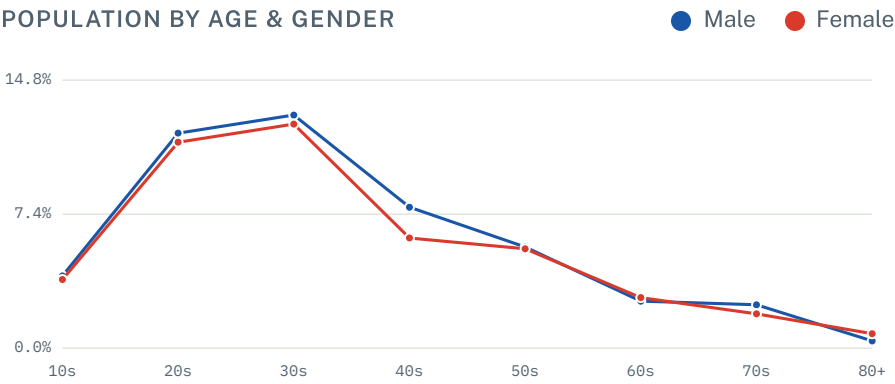

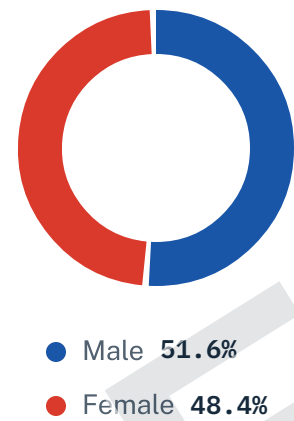

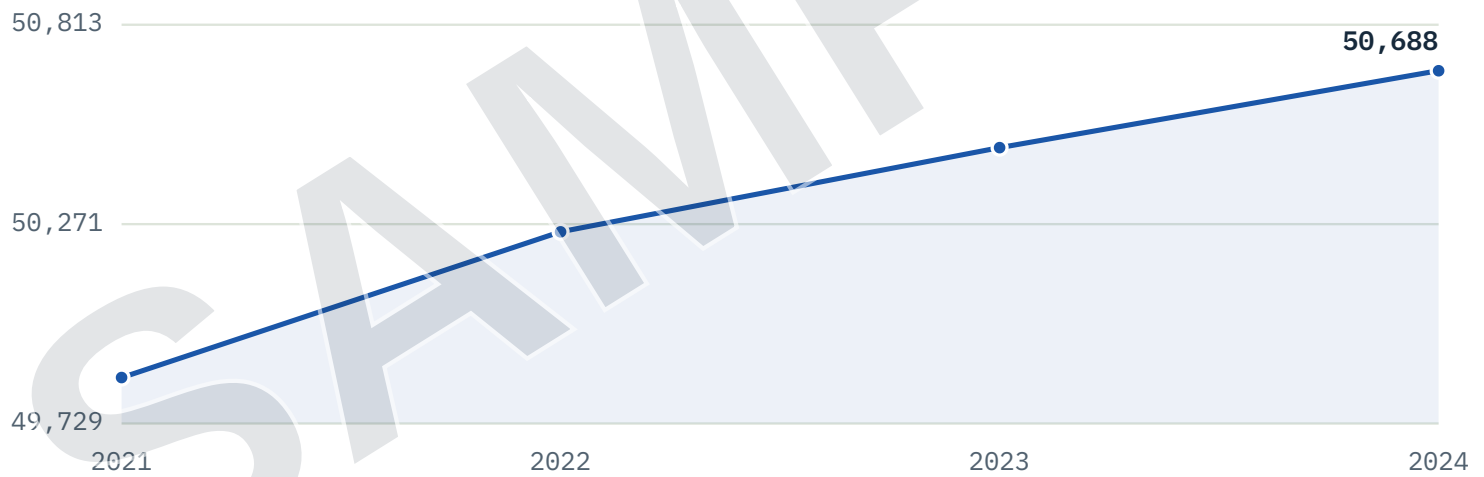

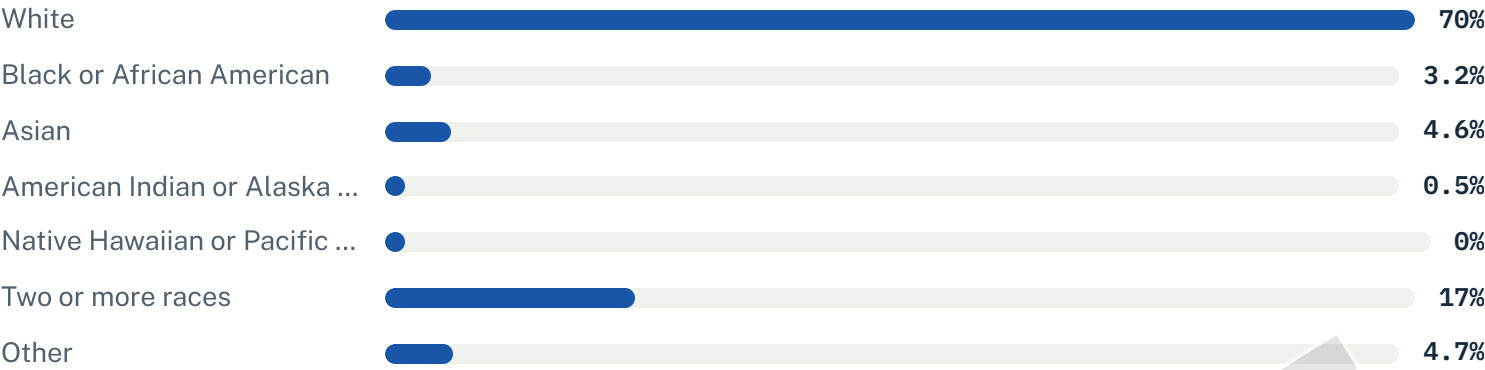

POPULATION OVER TIME



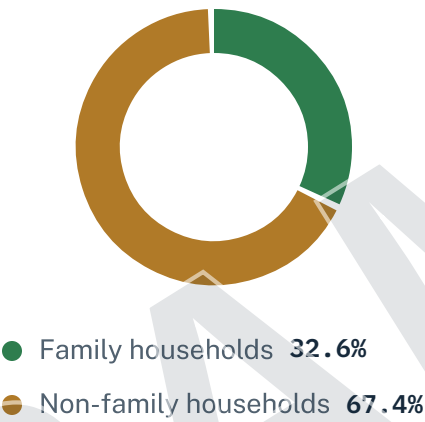

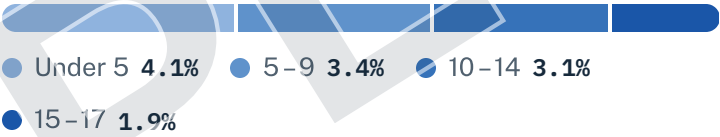

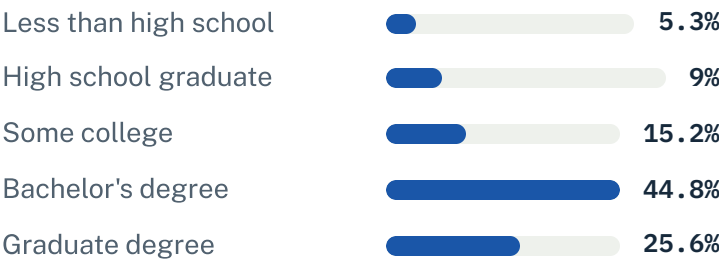

Property taxes are what owners report actually paying (Census ACS), so exemptions are included. The effective rate divides total taxes paid by the total owner-estimated home value in this ZIP — it is not the official assessor rate. The Census Bureau caps reported median taxes at \$10,000, so “\$10,000+” means the true median is at or above that cap.

HOUSING STOCK BY TYPE



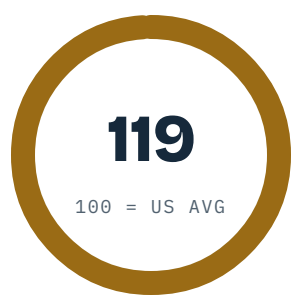
HOME VALUE OVER TIME

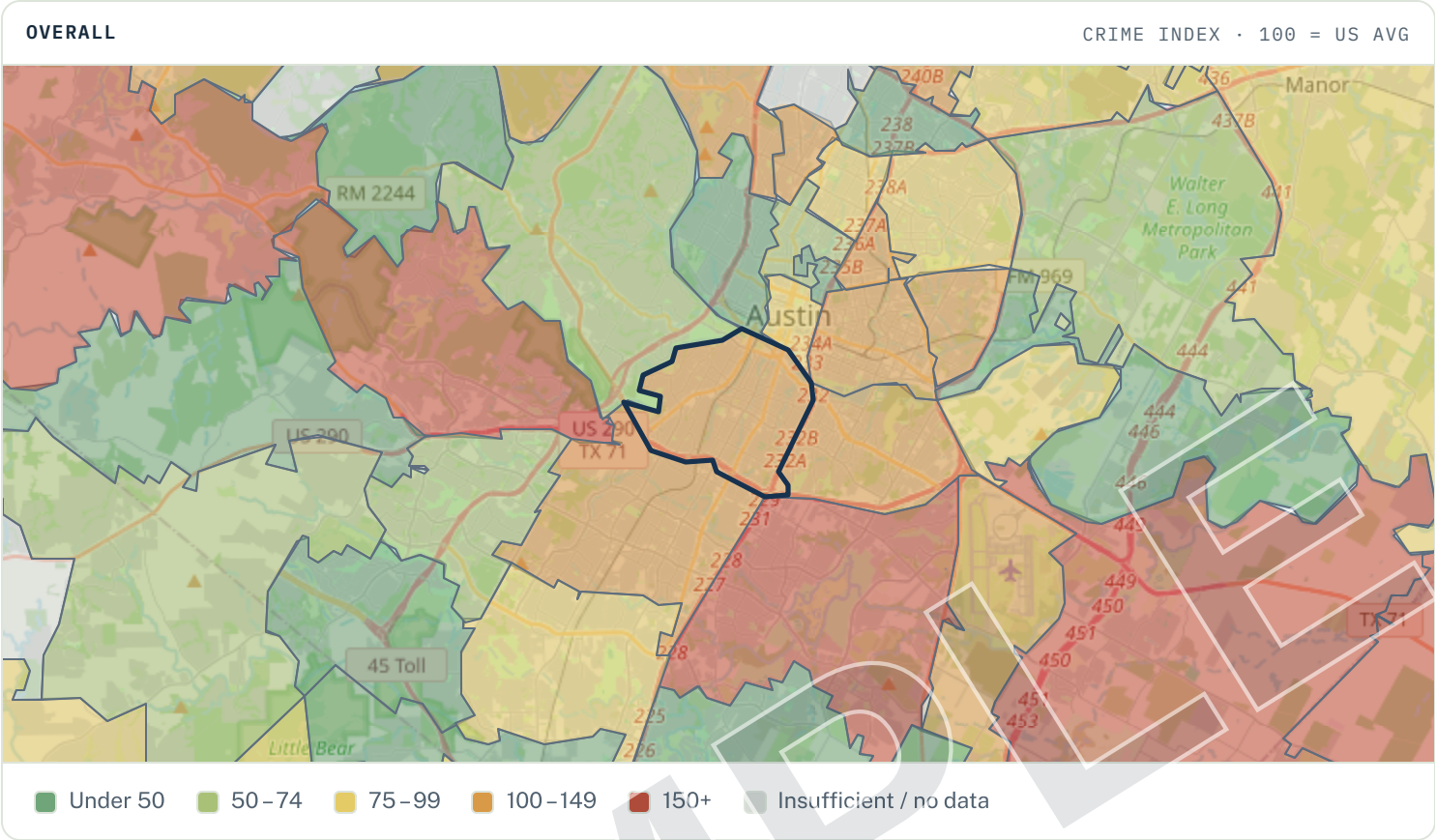

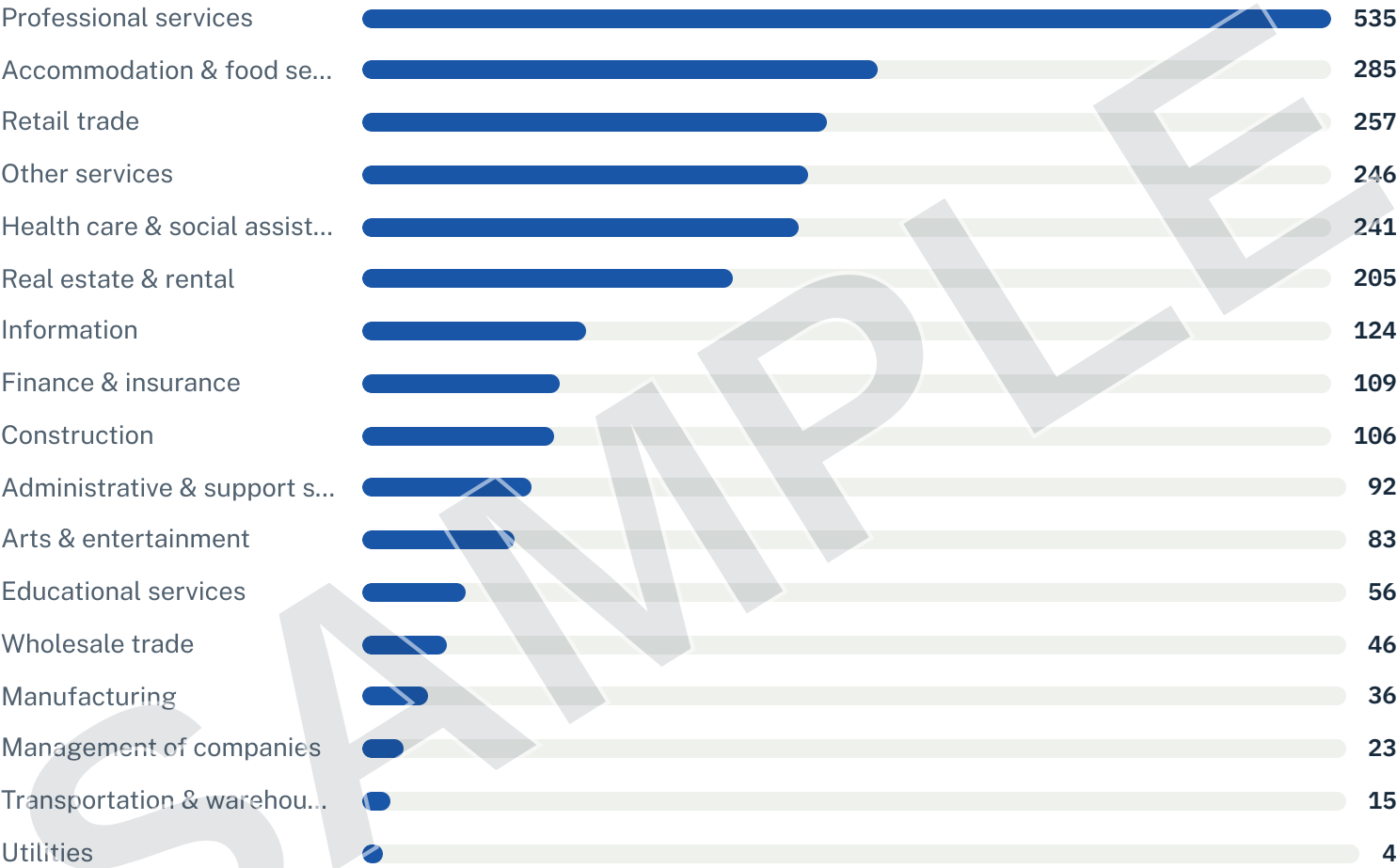

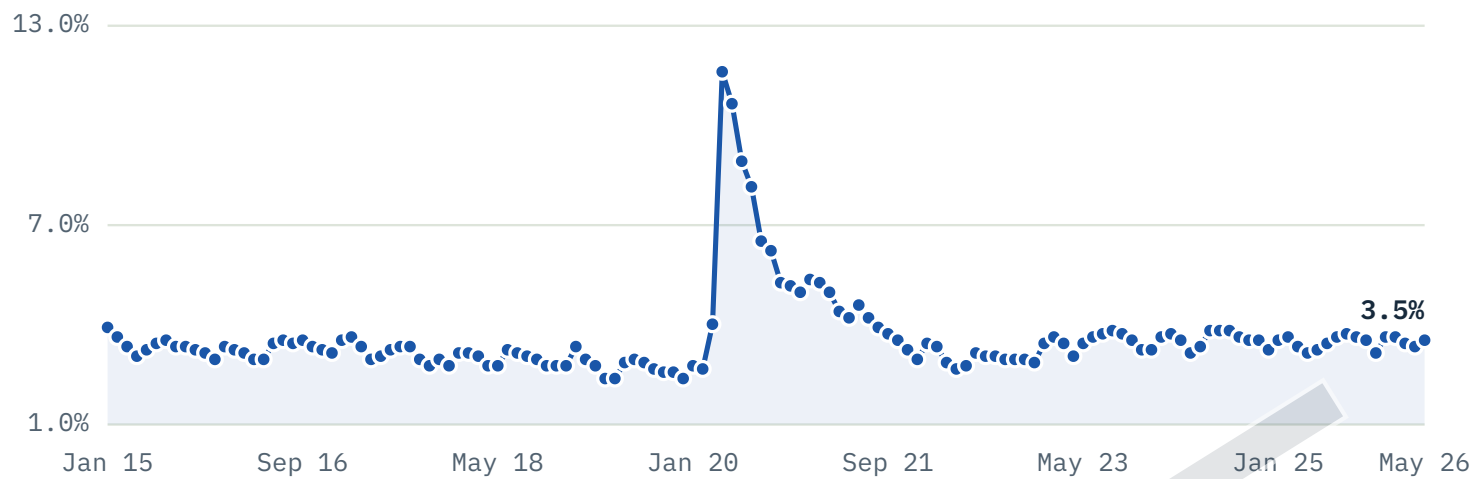

BUSINESSES BY INDUSTRY

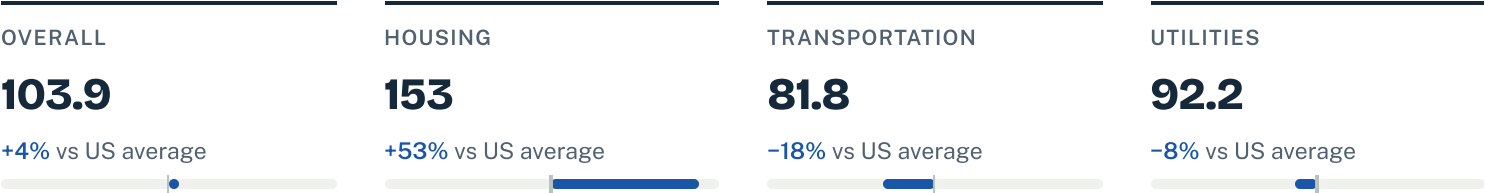


UNEMPLOYMENT RATE OVER TIME

HOW TO READ THESE NUMBERS

Each index compares typical costs in this area with the national average, where **100 = US average**: an index of 120 means costs run an estimated 20% above the national average, 90 means about 10% below. Here, housing at **153** runs an estimated 53% above the national average.

Overall — composite across the categories below plus everyday goods and services.

Housing — rent and home-ownership costs; usually the largest driver of the overall difference.

Transportation — fuel, transit fares and vehicle-related costs.

Utilities — electricity, water, heating and similar household services.

Indices are modeled estimates for the area, not price quotes. The model version is listed under this section.

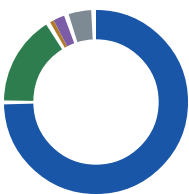

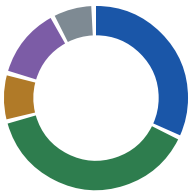

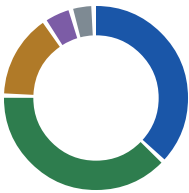

ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS (9)

“Alternative education” is a federal school category (NCES) covering a mix of programs: some are schools of choice with a specialized curriculum, others are disciplinary or juvenile-justice placements (DAEP, JJAEP, detention-center classrooms) that a district or court assigns rather than a family choosing to enroll. For placement programs, several districts often register their own campus at the same shared site, so near-identical entries are normal there, and enrollment is a single-day federal count that can be as low as one student for a short-stay program. They are grouped here so the main school list stays focused on schools families typically choose directly; every campus here is still counted in this ZIP's public-school total.

Facilities are listed by distance from the ZIP center, nearest first. The search starts within 5 mi and widens outward (up to 30 mi) only when nothing closer is found, so rural areas still see the nearest options. Distances are straight-line and drive times are rough estimates, not routed directions. Hospitals and clinics come from CMS federal registries — clinics are Medicare-certified facilities (community health centers, rural health clinics, ambulatory surgery, community mental health, outpatient rehab), not a directory of urgent-care or private practices. In an emergency, always call 911.

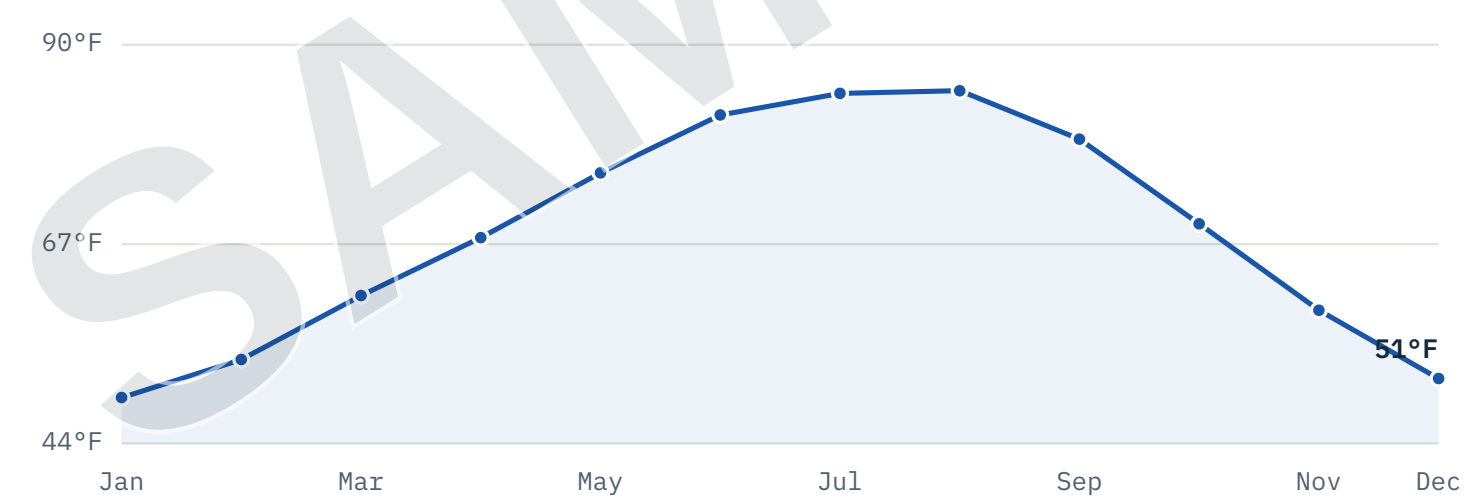
EPA Map of Radon Zones · lowest predicted indoor radon potential (county-level)

Annual precipitation — total rain plus melted snow in a typical year (NOAA 30-year climate normals); for context, the contiguous-US average is about 30 inches. Snowfall, where present, is shown separately.

Air quality · median AQI — the EPA Air Quality Index of a typical day in this county: 0–50 is good, 51–100 moderate, above 100 unhealthy for sensitive groups. “Unhealthy days” counts days over 150, when the air is unhealthy for everyone.

Radon zone — the EPA’s county-level classification of predicted indoor radon potential: Zone 1 is the highest (average indoor levels predicted above the EPA action level), Zone 2 moderate, Zone 3 the lowest. Radon varies house to house — the EPA recommends testing a home in any zone.

Places come from Overture Maps Places 2026-06-17.0, an open map dataset. They are points of interest known to that source — not an official register of businesses. Unlike a government business register it includes small operators without employees, and can list several delivery-only brands that share one kitchen, so counts run higher than official establishment counts. Distances are straight-line from the ZIP center. Each category is searched outward until something is found, so the radius can differ between categories and is stated on each one.
